





#### WRESTLING BASICS

**TAKE A LOOK AROUND.** Notice the referee has a red wristband and a green wristband. Also notice that each wrestler has a red or green ankle-strap. The referee will raise his red hand or his green hand during the match to tell the Scoring Table which wrestler has scored and which has been penalized. (See the Official Wrestling Signals guide on the next page.)

Take a look at the wrestling mat. The wrestlers must stay inside the ringed wrestling area. If both wrestlers move outside the ring, the referee will call out-of-bounds and the wrestlers will return to the center of the ring to begin again.

WHAT HAPPENS FIRST? Both wrestlers meet at the Scoring Table to check-in. They then move to the center of the mat, put on a Red or Green ankle-strap, take their appropriate positions, and shake hands. The referee blows the whistle and signals "Wrestle." Each wrestler tries to take control by taking his opponent to the mat and getting behind or on top of him. This is called a TAKEDOWN and is worth 2 individual points.

**HOW ABOUT POINTS?** The offensive wrestler (usually on top) is trying to stay on top and get a hold which will enable him to keep his opponent's shoulders on the mat for two seconds. This is called a FALL, a PINFALL, or simply "PINNING" your opponent. No individual points are awarded for a pin -- a PINFALL ends the match, and the pinner is the winner!

The first points in a match are likely to be given for a TAKEDOWN (2 points). The defensive wrestler (usually in the "bottom" or "down" position) is trying to ESCAPE (1 point) or REVERSE (2 points) his opponent by getting on top or behind.

The offensive wrestler can also earn NEAR FALL points, awarded by holding his opponent's shoulders in jeopardy (less than a 45 degree angle) near the mat for two to four seconds (2 points) or five or more seconds (3 points) without being able to pin his opponent.

**PERIODS AND START POSITIONS:** Every match has THREE periods. Each period lasts TWO minutes. The FIRST period starts from the STANDING or NEUTRAL position. For the SECOND period, the referee flips a red/ green "coin" to determine which wrestler chooses his starting position. The coin-toss winner may choose the TOP position, the BOTTOM position, the NEUTRAL position, or he can DEFER the decision to the next period, meaning the other wrestler chooses the position for this round. This may be to the toss-winner's advantage because he then gets to choose position for the third period, which is considered a more critical time in the match. In the THIRD period, unless there has been a previous DEFERment, the wrestler who lost the coin-toss in the previous period gets to choose his position for this round.

In the event of a PINFALL or TECHNICAL FALL (15 point advantage), the match ends during any period. Otherwise, the match ends at the end of the third period, with the wrestler having scored the most points declared the winner.

**TEAM POINTS:** For a PINFALL, a wrestler scores 6 points for his team. A win by FORFEIT is also worth 6 points. A TECHNICAL FALL (15 point advantage) scores 5 team points. A MAJOR DECISION (8 point advantage) scores 4 team points. A DECISION (1-7 point advantage) scores 3 team points. When all matches have been wrestled, the scores are tallied and the team with the highest score wins the tournament!

#### **SCORING**

Individual Match Points

#### Takedown - 2 points:

When a wrestler gets behind or on top of his opponent and takes him to the mat from the standing or neutral position.

#### Escape - 1 point:

Getting out from underneath one's opponent to a standing or neutral position.

### Reversal - 2 points:

Getting out from a defensive position and getting on top or behind one's opponent.

Near Fall - 2 or 3 points: Holding opponent's shoulders at 45 degrees or less to the mat for two seconds (2 points) or five or more seconds (3 points).

Penalty - 1 or 2 points to the other wrestler:

For illegal holds, infractions, technical violations, and unsportsmanlike conduct.

Stalling - 1 point to the other wrestler:

For having a position of advantage but failing to make an honest attempt to secure the fall.
