Remember A Year Ago

El Reno High School from Oklahoma came into the 30th Annual Lee High Invitational Wrestling Tournament held at the Ketcham Center ranked 6th in the nation by Wrestling USA. After placing nine wrestlers in the finals with seven winning individual crowns, it was easy to see just how good Archie Randall's team really was. The Indians won their second title in four years with 333 team points to outdistance Jesuit High School from New Orleans by 72.5 points. The real battle was for second place as the Blue Jays coached by Mark Strickland beat out cross-town rival Brother Martin coached by Kenny Spellman by 9.5 points. Martin was the defending Lee High Champion and the defending Louisiana state champions. Catholic High was fourth followed by Sulphur High in the field of 49 teams. DeLaSalle High School coached by Tim Duffy was awarded the Dale Ketelsen Award for Team Sportsmanship.

The action started off at 103 pounds with top seed Mark LoCoco from Brother Martin facing off with 3rd seed Bryan Shelton from El

Reno. LoCoco the defending Lee and State champ had his hands full with Shelton a freshman. After a scoreless first period Shelton was down to start the second period. He escaped and countered a shot by LoCoco and spun behind for the takedown then threw in the legs and rode LoCoco out for the remainder of the period. The third period LoCoco was down and it was still more of the same with Sheldon riding legs and double wrist rides. Sheldon was called for stalling but won the opening but 3-0. LoCoco did win his second state title in February.

The 112 pound finals had the top two seeds meet with sophomore Brice Wasseman of El Reno and Hugh Breckenridge a junior from Jesuit square off. Wasseman started off with a single leg and went straight to a cradle and went out of bounds. He came back with a head lever was warned for stalling and also called for potentially dangerous hold. The second period Wasseman got a reversal when he stood up and Breckenridge pulled him back on top of him. Wasseman let Breckenridge up for the escape and Breckenridge was called for stalling. In the third period Wasseman let Breckenridge up again for an escape then Wasseman got a takedown and a cradle for 5 points. Again Wasseman let Breckenridge go for an escape at the end of the period. Wasseman won 9-3.

Two state finalist met in the 119 pound weight class. Top

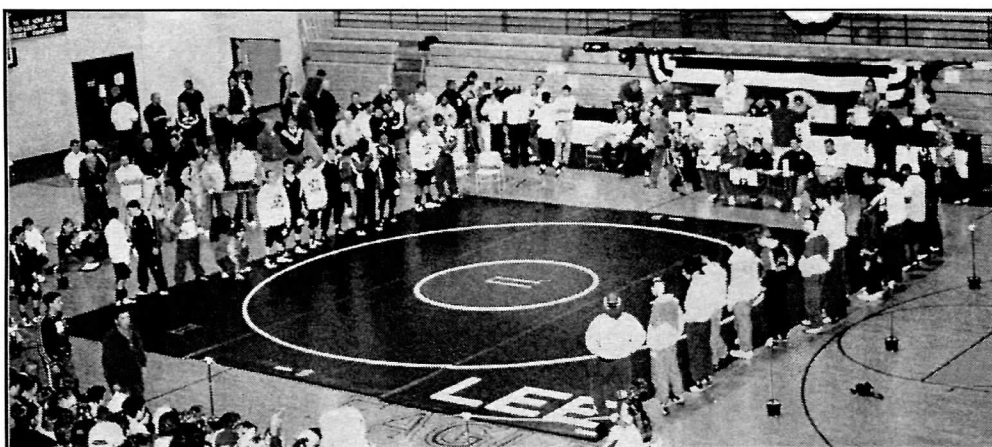
seed Brandon Sheldon a sophomore from El Reno and second seed Ryan Bozant a junior from Brother Martin. Bozant shot first but Sheldon went to the front head lock for the takedown, then tried to turn him with a head lever but couldn't. He let Bozant up for the escape. Sheldon then went to a snap down to another front head lock for the takedown and 4-1 lead going into the second period. The second period Sheldon stood up for the escape and went back to the front headlock but he couldn't finish it. In the third period Sheldon let Bozant up for one point, then back to the front head lock again for another takedown and let Bozant escape to end the match. Sheldon won 7-3.

State runner-up Jeff Smith a senior from Brother Martin faced Jonathan Harnsongkram from Jesuit in the 125 pound finals. After a scoreless first period Harnsongkram stood up for an escape to start the scoring in the second period. Smith got in on a single leg to get the takedown

then rode with a deep crotch ride preventing Jesuit from scoring. In the last period Smith was down and stood up but as Harnsongkram tried to back heel trip Smith to the mat he slipped and Smith quickly got the reversal and then tried to get the tilts working but couldn't turn Harnsongkram. Smith won 4-1. At the state meet in February these two met again with Smith winning 3-1.

At 130 pounds arch rivals Jesuit and Brother Martin faced off with top seed Stephen Liaw and second seed Rusty Kipker respectively. Liaw got a takedown in the last 10 seconds of the first period after Kipker was warned for stalling. The second period Liaw deferred the choice and Kipker took down, then escaped to close the gap at 2-1. The third period Liaw was down and Kiper let him up for a one point escape. Both wrestlers were called for stalling thus giving the technical point to Liaw since Kipker was warned in the first period. Liaw was going for the front headlock as the towel came in. Liaw a senior, later won the state title.

Top seed defending Lee and state champion Matthew Mazoch from Catholic High, faced Oklahoma state finalist David Baker from El Reno in the 135 pound finals. Baker a third seed beat Micah Easley from Zachary in the semi's 20-13 to advance. Mazoch got the first takedown. Later, Baker escaped to end the period. In the second round



Baker stood up for the escape and Mazoch went right back in with a firemans carry but they landed out of bounds. Baker went to a front head lock for a takedown and tried to cradle but got too high and Mazoch slipped out the back for an escape. In the third period Baker let Mazoch up for the escape. Mazoch got too extended on a takedown attempt and Baker spun behind for the takedown. Mazoch escaped for a point to bring him within one point but time ran out with Baker winning 6-5. Mazoch later went on to win his second Louisiana state title.

Buck Lorenzen a sophomore from El Reno beat top seed Justin Billiot from Brother Martin 7-2 in the semi's to advance to the 140 pound finals against Neil Reagan from Jesuit. Reagan the third seed beat Michael Alexander from John Ehret 7-4 in his semis match. Reagan scored quickly with a sweep single and went straight to a cradle and had Lorenzen on his back for a minute and forty-five seconds. It was amazing he didn't get pinned! Lorenzen was visibably worn out after the period. In the second period Reagen used a tilt to pick up 3 more back points to increase the score to 8-0. In the last period Reagan escaped and scored on another sweep single then Lorenzen scored an escape at the end of the match after being warned for stalling. Reagan won 11-1 and was voted as the Outstanding Wrestler in the tournament. Alexander from Ehret, later won the state title after he beat Reagan in their semi-final match at state.

The third and fourth seeds, Brandon Hebert of Brother Martin and Cole Koos from El Reno, faced off in the 145 pound finals. In the semi's Hebert knocked off top seed Eric Scallan of Holy Cross 5-0 and Koos won a close 13-11 overtime match over second seed Dustin Walker of Sulphur. Koos went with a front headlock to a shrug for a takedown. Hebert switched quickly for a reversal and threw his legs in, but Koos rolled out for and escape. At the buzzer Hebert got in on a single leg and came out the back door for the takedown. Koos let Hebert up to start the second period and quickly got a double leg takedown for 2 points. Almost as quickly, Hebert get another reversal to go ahead 7-5. There was no scoring in the final period as Hebert rode with his legs in but he was called for stalling. Hebert won 7-5 and went on to win the state title later in February.

The 152 pound finals had defending Lee champion Andrew Gruezke from Jesuit going against second seed Will Wintz from Catholic. Gruezke, with four falls coming into the finals, scored six takedowns in securing his name in the record books as a two-time champ. Gruezke lead 2-1 after the first period after getting a single leg takedown and letting Wintz go for the escape. Gruezke reversed for 2 points to start the period then Wintz escaped for one. Gruezke shot in for a single leg and Wentz countered hard with a whizzer but Gruezke got the takedown at the buzzer to go ahead 6-2. The third period Gruezke got four takedowns and was letting

Wentz up for escapes. Gruezke won 14-6. Both of these wrestlers faced off in the state finals with Gruezke winning 15-4.

Top seed Spiro Catsulis from Jesuit was knocked off in the semi's by fourth seed Leon Smith from El Reno 6-4 in overtime. Smith who wrestled at 215 a year ago was a senior with 16 wins coming into the finals. He faced second seed Brian Carter from DeLaSalle a junior with a 26-1 record. Smith arm dragged Carter for the takedown then let him up for the escape to complete the scoring in the first period. Smith escaped to start the second period. Carter tried a throw, slipped and Smith got the takedown to go ahead 5-1 at the end of the second period. Smith chose neutral in the final period and snapped down Carter for another takedown. Carter was awarded a penalty point for a technical violation. He later scored an escape to end the scoring. Smith won 7-3. Carter finished fourth in the state tournament.

At 171 pounds top seed Ryan Kline from Rummel faced third seed Jeremy Colbert from El Reno. Colbert beat second seed Chris Salinas from Central 13-4 in the semi's to advance. Action started off with Colbert getting a single leg for the takedown then cutting loose Kline for the escape. In the second period Kline got his legs in and was trying to turn Colbert but got too high. Colbert got a reversal, and at the buzzer Kline got an escape. Colbert let Kline up for the escape to start the third period and was warned for stalling as Klein made attempts to take-down Colbert. Colbert then got a double leg for a take-down and Klein was awarded a point for Colbert stalling again. Colbert won 6-4. Klein moved up to 189 at state and won the state title.

The 189 pound finals had unseeded Brad Petree from Byrd High School up against third seed Trey Cozic from Brother Martin. Petree was not seeded because no information was sent in on him for the seeding meeting. Top seed Johnny Ellis in this weight was knocked off early in the second round. Petree was at the eight seed spot on the brackets and he then faced Shane Srsen from Shaw in the quarters and won by a fall. In the lower bracket Cozic decisioned second seed Brendan Banks from Hahnville in his semi-finals match 8-3 to advance. Petree got in on a double leg and a bear hug and took Cozic to his back for a 3 point near-fall. Cozic chose neutral a the start of the second period but Petree got in on other double leg for a takedown. Cozic stood up for an escape and Petree went back to the double and bear hug for his third takedown. The third period Petree escaped and won 10-1.

The top two seeds at 215 pounds met in the finals. Both wrestlers were undefeated. Top seed Rocky Richey (22-0) from El Reno was the Oklahoma state champion in 2002 at 275 pounds. He faced Jessie Butler a junior from Istrouma with a 20-0 record. Butler had some trouble in the quarter-finals when he defeated Northside's Quentin Goodie 8-6 in overtime to get to the semi's. There was

no scoring in the first period although Butler was warned for stalling then called for stalling. Richey picked up the penalty point. In the second Richey escaped then got a takedown when Butler shot in from too far away and Richey spun behind. Butler escaped with 12 seconds left in the period and trailed 4-1. In the third Richey scored two takedowns and another penalty point and won 9-4.

Action started quickly in the 275 pound weight class as top seed Vaalyn Jackson a junior from Sulphur faced third seed Isaac Thomas a junior from host Lee. Thomas pinned second seed Paul Hodge from Holy Cross in the semi's to advance to the finals. Jackson quickly got the first takedown with Thomas escaping.

Then Thomas used a throw by for a takedown and right away Jackson got a reversal and as quickly Thomas got another escape. Jackson got a penalty point when Thomas grabbed Jackson fingers. The score after the first period was 5-5. The second period Thomas stood up for an escape and body locked Jackson and threw him to his back but they landed out of bounds. Jackson was warned for stalling as the period ended. The third period Jackson was awarded another penalty point this time for Thomas locking hands. Jackson then started coming up and threw his arm back and caught Thomas going backward trying to back heel trip. Jackson went straight into a body lock and got the only fall of the finals in 4:26.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY—1973 - 2003

The initial Lee High Invitational Wrestling Tournament started in 1973 with nine schools participating. The original concept was to host a one day meet whereby a wrestler could wrestle his three matches and be home that same night. The one day tournament lasted for seven years, but because of the number of teams entered, the meet was extended to two days. Jesuit High School of New Orleans, the defending State Champions, coached by Sam Harnsongkram, won the first tournament by 44 points over second place Lee High and Bishop Kelly (Tulsa, OK), which were tied with 83.5 points each. Jesuit, at that time, had a 51-1 dual meet record and was just beginning its dominance in the State in wrestling. The Blue Jays placed nine men in the finals and six won titles lead by senior, 126 pounder, **Mike Gaffney**, who was selected by the coaches as the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. **Rick Torczynski** of Bishop Kelly pulled the upset of the day with his third period fall of defending state champion, **John Malone** of Jesuit in the finals.

The 1974 tournament had eight teams and was a double elimination tournament with points being scored for all eight places. Defending tournament champion, Jesuit, left after the consolation finals because of a discrepancy with the officials. Jesuit, who was in third place when they left, forfeited their team points and had two wrestlers in the finals. Host team, Lee High, had six wrestlers advance to the finals, but none could win a title. Lee edged Holy Cross by a half point 98 to 97.5 without a single champion. This was the closest margin of victory ever by a winning team. Holy Cross had four individual champions and the Outstanding Wrestler in 155 pounder, **Keith Hosli**.

The third annual tournament in 1975 saw a scrappy Jesuit team come from ten points behind Holy Cross going into the finals and emerge a 74.5 to 70.5 winner. In the 105 pound finals, **Arthur Dupre** of Jesuit secured a third period fall to pick up four valuable team points. **John Holahan**, 112 pound teammate, scored late in the final period to gain a tie and go into overtime with **John Campbell** of Holy Cross. Holahan came back with a 8-0 overtime victory to pull his team within three points of the Tigers of Holy Cross. Jesuit then picked up wins at 145 pounds from **Mike Morales** and at 155 pounds from **Mark Diluzio** to nail down their team title.

In 1976 Jesuit, the defending State and Invitational Champs, was the team to beat from the outset of the tournament. The powerful Blue Jays rolled over the competition and finished 56 points ahead of Rummel to take their third title in four years. Holy Cross' 185 pounder, **Roy DeRoche's**, decision over previously undefeated **Jeff Tanguis** of Catholic earned him his first title and the Outstanding Wrestler award.

1977 saw no change in the tournament champion as

Jesuit won for the fourth time, 120.5 to 114.5 over cross-town rival, DeLaSalle. Baker High School's duo of **Kenny Duplessis** and **Mitch Jackson** combined to defeat **John Calabero** and **Gordon Stuart**, both defending State Champions from DeLaSalle, in the finals at 119 and 126 pounds, respectively. The best match of the meet, considered by many as the best match in the tournament's early history, was in the 98

pound finals when sophomore, **Mitch Michelli** of Brother Martin, was leading **Craig Seals** of East Jefferson 7-0 with 1:20 remaining in the match. Seals escaped and took Michelli down to his back for the fall with 50 seconds left. Defending State Champ, **Jeff Tanguis** of Catholic, was selected the meet's Outstanding Wrestler.

East Jefferson High School of Metairie, coached by George Trygg, came into the sixth Invitational favored to beat defending champion Jesuit. They did just that as the Warriors finished 11.5 points ahead of Brother Martin. "Trygg's Chargers" placed seven wrestlers in the finals and won five titles. Out of those five, three went on to capture State titles (**Craig Seals** 105, **Keith Varmall** 112, and **Jim Ravannack** 145). **Tom Messonnier** of Brother Martin was the Outstanding Wrestler with his 6-4 decision over undefeated **David Albrecht** of East Jefferson.

In 1979, for the third year in a row, a new champion was crowned as Brother Martin won by 16 points over St. Benedicts of Newark, New Jersey, 139 to 123. The Crusaders, coached by Ray Charboneau, won four out of five final matches (**Mitch Michelli**, **Tom Messonnier**, **Troy Cross** and **Mark Roberts**) and got help from three place winners to capture the seventh Invitational. **Messonnier** became the only wrestler to ever be selected Outstanding Wrestler twice, as he had three falls and a 12-0 decision over **John Daly** of St. Benedicts.

Again, 1980 had a new team champion in the most powerful and dominating team to ever wrestle in the Invitational: Booker T. Washington of Tulsa, Oklahoma coached by Ernie Jones. They won the Oklahoma State Tournament three years running and boasted the finest

high school wrestler in the country in 145 pounder, **Kenny Monday**. Monday became the first four time Oklahoma State Champion on his way to a 140-0-1 record. Washington set a team scoring record of 228

points with seven champions and four place winners. This was the first time the meet was held on two days. Monday was named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler with three falls and a 16-3 decision over undefeated **Mark Roberts** of Brother Martin.

The 1981 tournament was held to honor East Jefferson coach, George Trygg, who had been killed in an accident during the summer. Returning to the champions' throne room after a three year absence, were the Blue Jays of Jesuit. With only two winners, the team had to rely heavily on the scoring of the seven place winners to beat Brother Martin 175.5 to 169.5 to secure their fifth title. Brother Martin had four champs and the Outstanding Wrestler in 155 pounder, **Larry Gibson** (three time State Champion twice in Kentucky and once in Louisiana). Gibson's match with Jeanerette's **Jerry Lewis** in the finals pitted two undefeated wrestlers against each other. Gibson, who fell behind in the first period, rallied with his lightning quick takedowns to win convincingly, 15-4.

The tenth annual tournament saw the field swell to 25 teams. The top two teams were again Jesuit and Brother Martin. They fought it down to the wire with Coach Sam's "Boys" winning 176 to 169. Jesuit didn't have a single winner but again relied on the consolation matches to pick up the team's winning points. The biggest surprise of the meet was when unseeded **Rene Casadaban** of Brother Martin defeated Jesuit's top seed, Dennis Bertot, 9-7, in the semifinals and he then went on to beat undefeated **Eric Reeves** of St. Marks 9-8 in the finals. For his effort, Casadaban was selected the meet's Outstanding Wrestler.

The eleventh Invitational was expected to be a three way battle between favored Brother Martin, Holy Cross and R. L. Turner of Dallas as they headed the field of 25 teams. Brother Martin entered the finals with a six point advantage over Turner and a nine point edge over Holy Cross. Holy Cross slipped ahead of Turner and Brother Martin edged out Holy Cross by nine points to win their second team title 191 to 182. State champion, Erik Ketelsen of Belaire coached by his father, Dale an ex Iowa State wrestler, won his first Lee title and went on to win his second state championship. This year also saw two wrestlers repeat as winners with Turner's **Chris Burrow** and **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross earning their second titles. **David Rowan**, 105 pounder from Holy Cross, was the meet's Outstanding Wrestler with his fall (1:02) of **Mario Villanueava** of Brother Martin in the finals.

The twelfth tournament had thirty-five teams represented and again it was the "Crescent City" schools fighting for

first place. Brother Martin, the defending champion was the team to beat from the start of the tournament. With nine wrestlers placing and three making it to the finals with two champions, the Crusaders fell just 7.5 points short of breaking Booker T. Washington's record for team points. Jesuit was a surprise second place finisher with nine place winners while Acadiana with three champions and the Outstanding Wrestler (112 pounder **Craig Clark**)

finished fourth. R. L. Turners **Chris Burrow** had four falls and a 10-4 decision to become the first three time winner in the tournaments history. **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross became the second three time winner a few minutes later when he won his 210 pound weight class. Out of eight State Champs entered only four won their weights: Burrow, Guillot, **Ken Spellman** of Brother Martin and **Sean Montgomery** of West Jefferson.

In 1985, thirty teams competed for individual and team honors. Defending Invitational Champion, Brother Martin was the team to beat, as the Crusaders of Ray Charboneau brought 12 wrestlers with only 18 losses between them and four first place seeds. Martin was the defending State Champ of Louisiana, while R. L. Turner of Carrollton, Texas was the defending Texas State Champ, and Christian Brothers of Memphis, Tennessee was 3rd in the state of Tennessee. The field had five individual State Champs plus 16 undefeated wrestlers. The results of the 13th tournament were pretty much as expected. Martin scored 171.5 points followed by East St. John with 145.5. **Adam Bob** of Northside was voted the Outstanding Wrestler as the result of his pinning three-time Lee Champ and three-time State Champ, **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross 7-7, :26 OT in their 210 pound final. Two Brother Martin wrestlers reached the finals, but neither won and Martin became the third team to win without a single individual champion.

The 14th annual tournament in 1986 had Brother Martin winning its fourth consecutive title as it scored 215 point to outdistance the field of 29 teams. R. L. Turner was second with 130.5 points. The competition included four individual State Champions. Brother Martin placed six in the finals and won three titles. The Outstanding Wrestler award went to third seeded **Dean Arevalo** of Bonnabel as he defeated **Chris Holmes** of Brother Martin 7-2 in the finals of the 102 pound class. After the award, Arevalo said he never expected to win the top honor and that he was so excited he could hardly speak.

In 1987 Brother Martin, the winner of three State Championships in a row and five State Crowns in the

previous eight years, was the favorite team to defend its title. The Crusaders came in with two defending State Champs in **Greg Schmidt**, 13-0, and **Marc Devenport**, 17-0. When the smoke cleared, Martin won four individual titles along with its fifth team title and 208.5 points to finish ahead of Grace King, coached by Sam Sara, with 149 points. **Guy Mistretta** of Redemptorist, coached by his brother Craig, won his second Lee title and pushed his unbeaten streak to 82 in a row (his last loss was in the finals of the Lee tournament in 1985). Mistretta went on to capture three State Crowns. The Outstanding Wrestler award went to R. L. Turner's **Tommy Goodman**, a two time Texas State Champ, as he recorded five pins in route to his second Lee championship bringing his season record to 18-0 with 18 pins.

The tournament was not held in 1988.

The meet went into its 16th year at Lee when 26 teams entered the field. Jesuit High School came in with three top seeds and scored a record 265 points. The Blue Jays placed eight wrestlers in the finals. Only three managed to secure the title led by two time State Champ **Spencer Harris**, at 145 pounds. The Jays outscored second place Comeaux by 100.5 points. Harris went on to capture his third State title. There were nine undefeated wrestlers at the start of the meet with only four surviving the tough

two day competition. **Kerry Boumans** of Comeaux won his first Lee title and later captured his third State Championship. This year was also the first time since 1970 that the National Federation changed the weight classes. **Chris Guillot** of Holy Cross, at 130 pounds, was voted the Outstanding Wrestler by the coaches as he defeated Jesuit's **David LaFranca** 22-9 to push his record to 28-0. Coach Sam of Jesuit said, after the meet, "We were a little disappointed in the finals, but our kids did a good job to get to the finals and we were a little tired. But, you can't complain when you win by this much."

In 1990 the 17th annual tournament Jesuit High School looked like the team to beat. After Friday's competition, Jesuit held the team lead with 82.5 points, followed by Brother Martin with 67.5 and Buras with 65 points. Martin had six in the semis, while Jesuit had only four. Jesuit won two Lee titles, but got a little scare from Don Gagnard's Comeaux team with one champ. Comeaux finished 18 points behind the Jays. Martin dropped to third with 132.5 points. **Cloti Tate** of Baton Rouge High, coached by Robert Holder, recorded a 23-8 technical fall over Jesuit's **Clint Revet** and improved his record to 31-0. Tate was selected the Outstanding Wrestler of the

meet and went on to capture the State championship.

Cloti Tate of Baton Rouge High was the lone State Champ entered in the 1991 tournament. There were eight undefeated wrestlers. Again, Jesuit was back to defend their Invitational title and was favored but was likely to get strong competition from Lafayette High School and Catholic, coached by former Brother Martin and three time State Champ, Ken Spellman. After Friday's competition, Catholic was in first place with 106 points followed by Brother Martin, Lafayette and Acadiana. Catholic held on to win its first Lee Invitational by finishing ten points ahead of Lafayette. Tournament favorite, Jesuit, was fifth. The Bears had only one individual champion in **Dan Zvonek** at 135 pounds. Five of the eight undefeated wrestlers remained unbeaten. Riverdale's **Harold Bourgeois, Jr.**, coached by his father was voted the Outstanding Wrestler in the 18th annual Invitational with his 12-5 win over previously undefeated **Mike Revere** (23-0) of Lafayette.

The 19th annual Lee Invitational was Jesuit's stepping stone to setting a team scoring record of 269 points, with five individual champions to outdistance Catholic High by 56.5 points. The Blue Jays captured their ninth team title under Coach "Sam". One outstanding match in the finals was at 103 pounds. Jesuit's **Rene Baumer** avenged his lone loss to Tara's **Ben Kristonis** (21-0). Baumer defeated Kristonis at his own game of takedowns and won 7-3. **Murat Akdamar**, third seed from Jesuit, a sixth place finisher in 1991, was voted the Outstanding Wrestler via his defeat of second seeded **Michael Weber** of Catholic (16-4), and his pinning of first seeded **J. J. Fletcher** of Acadiana in the finals in a time of 3:56. Three wrestlers went on to win their second State title: Tara's **Brad Goudeau**; Catholic's **Dan Zvonek**; and Jesuit's **Mike Hanemann**. At the tournament this year, we missed long time friend and wrestling colleague Ken Cole, due to his untimely death during the prior summer.

— Jesuit Sets Tournament Scoring Record — 277.5 Points For 13 Weights Along With Tenth Title

The results of the twentieth annual tournament, with a field of 38 teams plus W. A. Berry from Birmingham, AL was no surprise as Coach Sam Harnsongkram's Jesuit Blue Jays won their second consecutive Lee High Invitational and their tenth overall title scoring 277.5 points. Catholic High, coached by Kenny Spellman was a distant second with 120.5 points followed closely by Steve Lotef's Northside squad with 114 points and Grace King team of Coach Sam Sara with 113 points. Jesuit High School, the New Orleans team on Carrollton Ave.

had five individual winners and six place winners to again set the tournament team scoring record. Two-time state champion **Mike Hanemann** boosted his season record to 24-0 with his five first period falls on the way to his second Lee title and the Outstanding Wrestler Award. This year, five wrestlers won their second Lee Invitational title: **Rene Baumer** and **Mike Hanemann** of Jesuit; **Jonathan Schudmak** of Grace King; **Shane Colomb** of Lafayette; and **Coleman Ruiz** of Holy Cross—considered by many coaches to be the “most physical wrestler in the tournament.”

Ten wrestlers came to Lee with undefeated records and six left that way (**Paige Russell**-Belaire, 34-0; **Rene Baumer**-Jesuit, 18-0; **Mike Hanemann**-Jesuit, 24-0; **Sean Grilletta**-Jesuit, 25-0; **Coleman Ruiz**-Holy Cross 32-0 and Istrouma's **Robert Walker**, 13-0). If you had been seeded first or second, then you would have won the tournament, as eight first and five second place seeds won titles. The finals saw two matches go into overtime to decide the winner. First-seeded **Mike Babineaux** of Northside scored a reversal in the second period of overtime to defeat previously undefeated **Paul Walker** of Catholic 8-6 for the 103 pound title. Then in the 135 title bout, second-seeded **Richard Barnett** of Jesuit handed Brusly's **Payton Schouest** his first loss of the season with a takedown in the first period of overtime to win 11-9.

Thirty eight teams competed in the 21st tournament which was won by Coach Sam Harnsongkram's Jesuit Blue Jays for the fifth time in six years. The "Jays" with two champions and eight place winners, outdistanced a solid Northside team by 51 points. Northside from Lafayette, coached by Stephen Lotief, had four individual champions. Jesuit brought only 12 wrestlers to the tournament but with only a combined total of 14 losses between them. Ten of those 12 wrestlers went on to place and score 238 points to claim the tournament championship. **Rene Baumer** became only the third

wrestler to win three Lee titles but had his hands full with Alabama state champion **Stewart Holt** of W. A. Berry. Baumer won a close 5-4 decision. Catholic's **Seamas Dore'** was selected by a vote of the coaches as the meets Outstanding Wrestler with his 13-5 decision over **Chance Deranger** of Northside for his second Lee title. Dore' later went on to fracture his foot at practice and never got back to his championship form by the state tournament but still placed sixth at state. Northside's **Mike Babineaux** remained undefeated and captured his second title with his 17-7 victory in the 112 pound finals. Nine wrestlers came to Lee with perfect records, but when the smoke cleared only six of them remained that way. Eight state champions were featured in the meet lead by Division I two-time state champ **Ben**

Kristonis of Tara, Jesuit's **Rene Baumer**, **Mike Babineaux** of Northside, along with Division II three-time state champ **Joey Cortez** of Basile, two-time champ **Brad Macha** of Redemptorist, **Taun Nguyen** of Buras, and Tara's **Brad Johnson** (formally of Bishop Sullivan). **Stewart Holt** of W. A. Berry was the defending Alabama state champion.

The 1995 edition of the Lee High Invitational Tournament was the first time the meet was moved to a neutral site away from the Lee High campus. The Morris C. Plotts Complex on the grounds of the Jimmy Swaggart Ministries provided a bigger mat area with less crowding and better parking. The facilities were top notch and with the field of 39 teams competing for honors, the tournament was a huge success. L.H.S.A.A. adopted the new weights for the 1994-95 season so therefore we were using the new weights for the tournament this year.

But, business as usual, defending champion Jesuit High School had the team title wrapped up before the final round of the tournament started. The New Orleans-based power used its depth to pile up points early as the “Blue Jays” had just one individual champion, 275 pound **John Culver**. Jesuit had 10 place winners out of the thirteen weight classes plus 32 falls out of their 58 matches to compile 242 points and finish 114 points ahead of second place Catholic High school. The race was really for second place as Grace King, Comeaux and Rummel were all in striking distance of second place.

A total of 13 state champions were entered in the tournament (7 Div. I, 5 Div. II, 1 Alab.) with 14 wrestlers

having undefeated records. **Mike Babineaux** of Northside became only the fourth wrestler to capture three Lee titles. Grace King's **Chad Phillips** was voted by the coaches as the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler with his pin in the finals of the 151 pound weight class. Five Division II wrestlers made it to the finals with three winning titles. Those three (**Patrick Luke** of Hanson, **Tuan Nguyen** of Buras, and **Brad Macha** of Redemptorist) also won their weight classes at the Louisiana State Championships held at UNO Health & PE Center. McKinley's **Larry Batiste** won his second Lee title with his close 16-15 decision over **Brian Veprek** of Jesuit while going on to his second state championship. **Chad Boudreaux** of Rummel, **Ryan Hess** (3) of Holy Cross and **Korak Simmons** of DeLaSalle all won state championships.

The 1996 edition of the Lee Invitational had a new champion in Brother Martin High School coached by Mark Wisniewski (a Lee finalist in '81) and Robbie Dautrive. The Crusaders had not won the tournament

since 1987 which was dominated by Jesuit High School at that time. Martin had nine of their 14 wrestlers place in the top six to run away with the team title, scoring 216 points to runner-up Jesuit which had 193.5 points. Hoover High School, coached by ex-Auburn wrestler Duke Cheminto, from Hoover, Alabama, was third with 170 points out of a record field of 44 teams. Brother Martin had five wrestlers reach the finals with only **Jacob**

Gruwell winning a title. In one of the best matches of the tournament, **Chad Broudeaux** of Rummel decisioned McKinley's **Roderick Ratcliff** 7-6 for his second Lee title, and for his efforts **Boudreaux** was named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. **Patrick Luke** of Hanson Memorial in Franklin also won his second title. Another match that was highly anticipated was in the 189 pound finals with two state champs, both with unblemished records on the line. **Daniel Cormier** of Northside defeated St. Paul's **Matt Fersch** 13-5 for his first Lee title. Fourteen wrestlers entered the competition without losses on their records, but only five left undefeated. From the championship finals of a year ago 12 wrestlers won either Division I or II State titles. Jesuit came back strong at the state tournament, held at UNO Lakefront Arena and defeated the Crusaders by 199.5 to 194 for their 16th state title. Along with **Luke, Gruwell, Boudreaux,** and **Cormier** two other wrestlers were back to defend their titles—**Matt Orillion** of Jesuit and **Dennis Parker** of Catholic.

The 24th annual tournament had few surprises in the way of the team champion as Jesuit set a tournament scoring record 280.5 points, surpassing the 1993 record of 277.5 points by the Blue Jays. The Blue Jays placed seven wrestlers in the finals with **Creighton Mullins** and **Jason Leckert** winning individual titles to lead Jesuit to its fifth Lee title in six years. Brother Martin was a distant

second. **Chad Boudreaux** of Rummel won his third consecutive Lee title and became the fifth wrestler to accomplish this feat in 24 years. Rummel teammate **Patrick Ritchie** defeated Hanson's two-time champion **Patrick Luke** in their 119 pound final match to earn the Outstanding Wrestler award for the tournament. The finals saw eleven weight classes where the first and second seeds met head-to-head. Brother Martin's **Jacob Gruwell** successfully defended his title along with **Dennis Parker** of Catholic and **Daniel Cormier** of

Northside to become two-time Lee champions. The Lee winners to go on to win Div. I State titles were **Leon Ngchee**-Grace King, **Mullins**-Jesuit, **Ritchie**-Runnel (2), **Roderick Ratcliff**-McKinley (2), **Boudreaux**-Rummel (3), **Gruwell**-Br. Martin (2), **Leckert**-Jesuit, **Parker**-Catholic, **Cormier**-Northside (3), and **Roxie Shelvin**-Franklin. The Div. II State Champions were **Wyman Alligood**-Buras, **Luke**-Hanson (3), **Josh Friedman**-Buras (2), **Josh Fontenot**-Bishop Sullivan (2), and **Bryan Seymour**-Brusly. Considering the fact that Jesuit had only three seniors and 11 underclassmen, the domination of the tournament became even more impressive. One great match was in the 152 pound finals with **Josh Fontenot** of Bishop Sullivan being down 5-0 to **Trey Landry** of Jesuit in the first period and coming back to tie the score 5-5 at the end of the second period. **Fontenot** then scored on a reversal and caught **Landry** on his back and secured the fall in 5:17 to win Bishop Sullivan's first Lee title.

The 25th silver anniversary of the Lee Invitational was a record setting Jesuit team from New Orleans that was on a mission to break their own team scoring record, which they did with 296 points to 211 points for runner-up Brother Martin, the Blue Jays nailed down their 14th team title. Jesuit one of the premier teams in the South had twelve out of fourteen wrestlers placed for Coach Sam Harnsongkram's team. Individually all four defending champions won for the second time as McKinley's **Roderick Ratcliff, Josh Fontenot** of Bishop Sullivan, **Matt Orillion** of Jesuit and **Roxie Shelvin** of Franklin all go in the record books. Only six first seeds won as upsets filled the tightly packed gym. Three finalist a year ago Brusly's **Barrett Wilson, Mark Delesdernier** and **Trey Landry** both of Jesuit all made it back to the finals but couldn't get it together to secure a wins. **Hiram Greer** was selected the Outstanding Wrestler with his four falls and major decision in route of his first period pin in the finals for his first Lee title. Heavyweight **Shelvin** pinned his way through the tournament and pinned undefeated **Kevin Miller** (25-0) of Hoover. Every match **Roxie** has wrestled in the last two years resulted in a fall except one. He was 45-0 with 44 pins in the last two years. Hoover's **Murry Meadow** pushed his record to 24-2 with his decision over first seeded **Patrick Noble** of Jesuit and became the 12th set of brothers to win at Lee as his brother **Joe Meadow** won at 275 in 1996.

— **El Reno, Oklahoma** — *"In the House"* **Sets Team Scoring Record**

It looked like the Oklahoma "Gold Rush" when El Reno High School came to town last year to win the 1999 Lee Invitational with a record score of 346.5 points to outdistance Brother Martin by 85 points. Coach Archie Ran-

dall's Indians had six champions and six wrestlers to place out of the fourteen wrestlers that they brought to the meet. The team was lead by Outstanding Wrestler **Tyrone Lewis** (19-0) at 160 pounds. **Lewis** was ranked the number one wrestler in the country after the season was over. El Reno went on to capture their fourth consecutive Oklahoma state championship. Brother Martin was second with three champs and six place winners followed by defending champion Jesuit High School. Brother Martin coached by Robert Dautrive and Kenny Spellman came back in February and won the state championship unseating Jesuit after eleven years. Of the top five teams, three were from out of state as Hoover and Scottsboro both of Alabama were fourth and fifth respectively. **Harold Cage** of Capitol (28-2) defended his 119 pound title with his second win. Harold went on to capture his second state title. St. Martin's **Danny Navar** (23-1) won the 135 pound weight class and became the first wrestler from St. Martins to win at Lee. **Navar** also won his third Division II state title. Brother Martin looked to **P. J. Trentacosta**, **Brad Higgins** and **Paul Hale** for their three champs. **Higgins** won state and will be back to defend his Lee title. Lafayette High had two champs in state champ **Eddie Webb** (22-0) and **Kris Louvierre**. Number one seed at 275 was **Leonce Crump** but he was disqualified in the semi's for a slam and the big show down between **Crump** and **Paul Hale** (28-0) had to wait until the state finals in which **Hale** won in overtime.

In the 2000 tournament defending Division I State Champion, Brother Martin High School came to Lee on a mission: To break El Reno's team scoring record. The Crusaders coached by Robbie Dauterive came within just 13 points of establishing a new scoring record. Winning 27 matches Friday night by falls, Brother Martin wasn't pushed hard. Martin placed eight in the finals with five winning championships. Thirteen Martin wrestlers placed fourth or better in the 27th annual tournament. Jesuit High School winner of 14 Lee titles in the past, was second with 229 points, 104.5 points behind Martin. Nine wrestlers came into the meet undefeated but only five remained that way. Eight underclassmen won titles, while Grand Lake's **David Cox**, a junior won the Outstanding Wrestler Award. **Brad Higgins** of Brother Martin became the only wrestler to repeat as champion, as he was a 1999 champ at 189 pounds, and repeated in 2000 with his second title at 160 pounds. Jesuit was followed by Rummel, Catholic and St. Pauls in the top five spots in the field of 42 teams. Two Division I state champions (Richie Dixon and Matt Hasenkampf) were defeated as were three (Thung Nguyen, Nick Accardo and Scott Naquin) Division II state champs.

Nine Division I state champions and one Division II state champ came from the Lee winners. Brother Martin repeated as Division I state champions. St. Pauls was the Division II state champions while Brusly won state in the newly formed Division III.

Breaks Team Scoring Record set by El Reno
Has record 10 finalists-8 Champions

The 28th annual tournament drew a record number 46 teams when the doors opened. When everything was finished Saturday night, Brother Martin had won their ninth Lee title. They successfully defended their title by in setting a team scoring record of 352 points. This broke the two year record set by El Reno High School of 346.5 points. The Crusaders also set an individual title record when **Chuck Stall** won the 275 pound weight division. His win was the eight individual title for Brother Martin in the tournament thus breaking the 22 year old record of 7 titles held by Booker T. Washington High School. Coach Robbie Dauterive coached one of the best teams in Louisiana history. This team entered the tournament with six number one seeds and proceeded to win eight individual titles and had two runner-up finishers. No other team has ever had 10 finalists. Thirteen out of fourteen wrestlers placed for the Crusaders and they recorded 31 falls during the meet. Jesuit, a team with 14 team titles under their belt, was a distant second with 246.5 points followed by Rummel, Catholic and Parkway to round out the top five teams. Four wrestlers entered the meet undefeated with only **Alex Knight** of Catholic keeping his unblemished record in tack. **Knight** won his second title as did Brother Martin's, **Adam Manguno** and **Chris McElrath**, and Jesuit's **Chris Gaffney** and **Marshall Delesdernier**. Catholic's **Wade Whitty** earned the Outstanding Wrestler Award for his victory in the 130 pound finals and St. Pauls team won the Dale Ketelsen Team Sportsmanship Award given to the team that displays the most sportsmanship in honor of longtime wrestling coach Dale Ketelsen. After the 2000-01 season Brother Martin coach Robbie Dauterive and Jesuit's legendary coach Sam Harnsongkram both retired from coaching.

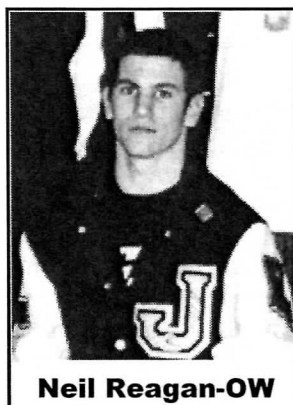
The 29th annual tournament, was held at the Ketcham Center with 49 teams competing, saw two three-time champions crowned, four wrestlers win their second title and Brother Martin defend their team title with eleven wrestlers in the finals. Three wrestlers were undefeated at the beginning of the matches with only one remaining that way. Brother Martin's **Chris McElrath** and Jesuit's **Marshall Delesdernier** both won their third title. **Kenton Rivas** from Lafayette remained undefeated and won his second title. **Patrick Mitchell**, **Joe Gulotta (OW)** and **Chuck Stall** all from Brother Martin won for the second time. Three wrestlers have a chance to be two-time winners this year as Brother Martin's **Mark LoCoco**, Catholic's **Mathew Mazoch** and Jesuit's **Andrew Gruezke** all won as juniors. Coach, Kenny Spellman has the distinction of winning Lee as a wrestler at Brother Martin ('84), and as a coach of two different schools, Catholic High ('91) and now Brother Martin in 2002.

Tornadoes are a common sight in Oklahoma, but this time they were spotted in the Ketcham Center during the 30th Annual Lee Invitational Wrestling Tournament. The Indians of El Reno High School

showed the fans why they were ranked 6th in the nation by USA Wrestling and first in the wrestling tradition soaked state of Oklahoma. Archie Randall's team walked away with seven individual championships and the team title with 333 points, 72.5 points ahead of Jesuit High School. Defending champs Brother Martin was a close third with 250 points followed by Catholic and Sulphur. This was El Reno's second title in five years as they won the tournament in 1999. Jesuit, coached by Mark Strickland had five finalists and three individual champions. **Neil Reagan** from Jesuit, a third seed was voted the outstanding wrestler with his 11-1 major decision over 4th seed **Buck Lorenzen** of El Reno in the 140 pound finals. **Andrew Gruezeke** won his second title with his 14-6 major decision win over Catholic's **Will Wintz** in the 152 pound finals. Two other defending Lee champs were denied their second title. Brother Martin's senior **Mark LoCoco** at 25-0, ran into trouble with freshman **Bryan Shelton** of El Reno at 103 pounds. Shelton won 3-0 and pushed his record to 19-3. **Mathew Mazoch** from Catholic also a defending Lee champ lost a close 6-5 match to El Reno's **David Baker**.

Brother Martin placed six wrestlers in the finals and came away with two titles. **Jeff Smith** the top seed at 125 pounds and **Brandon Hebert** the fourth seed at 145 pounds. **Brad Petree** a state finalists a year ago was unseeded but won the 189 pound title with 10-1 major decision over **Trey Cozic** from Brother Martin. At 215 pounds **Rocky Richey** a state champion in Oklahoma at 275 in 2002, remained undefeated at 23-0 with his 9-4 decision over previously undefeated **Jesse Butler** of Istrouma who was 20-0. Top seed **Vaalyn Jackson** from Sulphur scored the only fall in the finals over Lee's **Isaac Thomas** at 275 pounds. In a field of 48 teams, 304 wrestlers wrestled over 600 matches in the "wrestle-back" format that forces a wrestler to be at his best at all times, the 30th annual tournament was a big success.

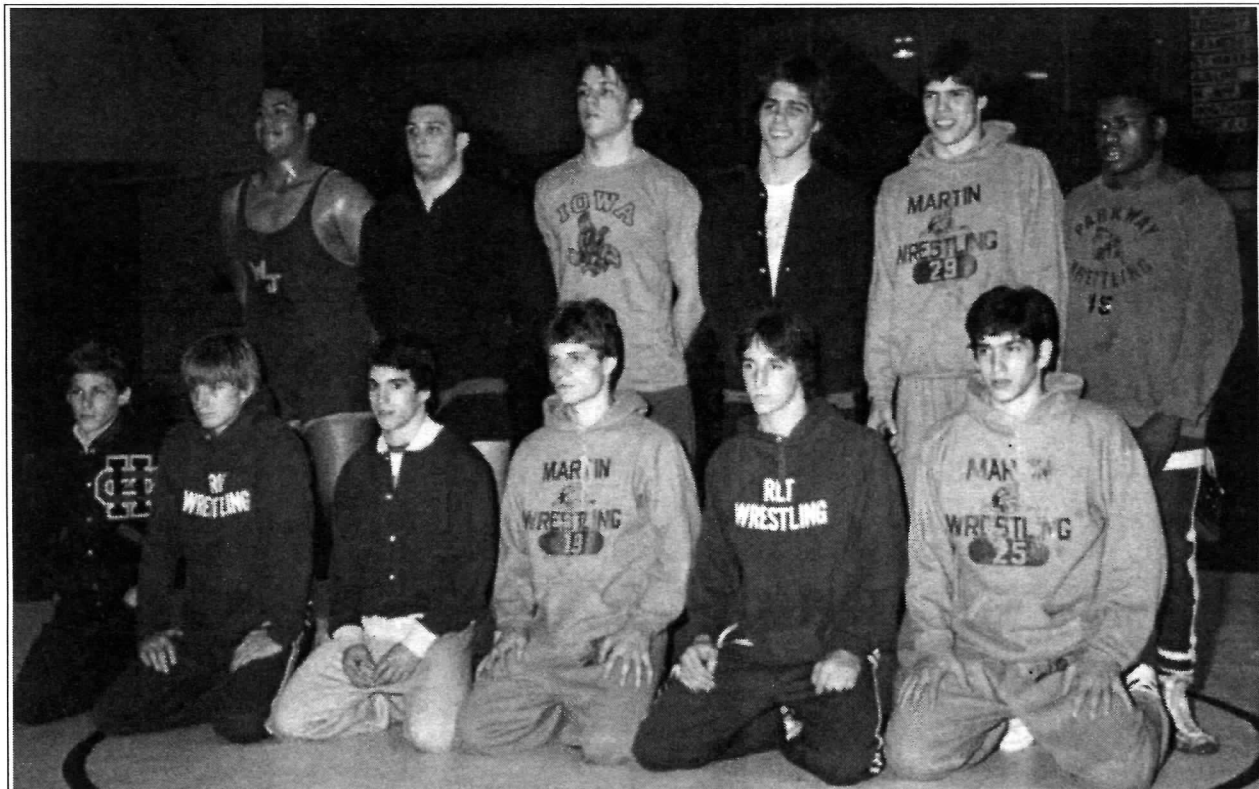

Brother Martin of New Orleans, has the next most team titles with ten (five in a row) and four runner-up spots.

Brother Martin also is second in total individual titles with 50, followed by Catholic with 27 and Holy Cross with eighteen.

Fifty-seven *different* schools have won an individual title.

Fourteen sets of brothers have won the tournament.

Three (3) sets from Jesuit
Two (2) sets from Tara
Two (2) sets from Brother Martin
One (1) each from Catholic, Grace King, Hoover, B. T. Washington and El Reno
One (1) set had a brother at Jesuit and the other brother at Brother Martin

Seven Invitationals have been won by 10 or less points, with the closest margin of victory coming in 1974 by Lee with its .5 point victory over Holy Cross. The largest margin of victory was by Jesuit High School in 1993 with its 157 point difference over Catholic.

El Reno High School from El Reno, Oklahoma coached by Archie Randall, was the first team to go over 300 points in winning the team title. They scored 346.5 points to set the team scoring record in 1999 which lasted two years until Brother Martin High School set a new team record with a score of 352. This was the second year that Brother Martin coached by Robbie Dauterive has gone over the 300 point total.

Roxie Shelvin of Franklin, coached by Dr. Nick Accardo, Jr. was 65-0 his junior and senior years with 44 straight falls. There are only three prep wrestlers in the nation to have had more pins in a row.

Adam Bob of Northside probably scored the biggest upset in the tournaments history when he pinned in over time, three-time Lee Champion and three-time state champion **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross, to stop his bid for an unprecedented four Lee titles.

Another match ranked up as one of the tournaments best was in 1997 in the 119 pound finals where Rummel's Division I state champ **Patrick Ritchie** stopped Hanson's two time Division II state champ **Patrick Luke** in his bid for a third individual title by the score of 6-5 to earn him the Outstanding Wrestler Award in the 24th Tournament.

Patrick Luke of Hanson Memorial in Franklin, LA, coached by Dr. Nick Accardo, Jr. won 28 out of 32 tournaments that he entered during his high school career. This is a Louisiana record.

Chris Gaffney of Jesuit with his win in the 27th tournament completed the circle where a father-son combination have won the tournament. **Mike Gaffney** was voted the Outstanding Wrestler in the first tournament in 1973. Mike went on to capture two state titles and had a 79-0 record. **Chris** (130-10) won Lee twice and was also a two-time state champion .

The 2000 Outstanding Wrestler award went to junior **David Cox** from one of the smallest schools in Louisiana. **Cox** of Grand Lake High School was the only wrestler on the team.

Nick Accardo a two-time state champion from Hanson Memorial in Franklin was named to National High School Coaches Association Academic All-American team for 1999-2000. **Nick** had 146 wins in his high school career with 99 falls. He was coached by his father, Dr. Nick Accardo an ex-Jesuit wrestler from the early 70's.

Chad Boudreaux of Rummel, **Roderick Ratcliff** of McKinley, **Eddie Webb** of Lafayette, **Daniel Salter** of Northshore, **Richard Dixon** and **Joe Gulotta** of Brother Martin and **Andrew Gruezke** of Jesuit High Schools, were all selected as Louisiana's state winner of the Dave Schultz High School Excellence Award. Their names will be engraved on the Dave Schultz plaque that is displayed in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. This award is given to a high school senior with selection based equally on wrestling success, scholastic achievement and character, citizenship and community leadership.

Three-time Lee Champion **Chad Boudreaux** from Rummel, finished 2nd at the National Junior College Wrestling Championships in 1999. He was a part of the National Championship Team that had all eight wrestlers finish as All-Americans. Colby Junior College from Colby, Kansas won the tournament by a wider margin of points than any previous team in NJCAA history.

Ben Kritsonis a three-time state champion from Tara High School, coached by Doug Payne was the 118 pounder on the University of Iowa wrestling when they won the NCAA title in 1999.

Daniel Cormier a senior in 2001 from Oklahoma State University (from of Northside High School coached by Steven "Tank" Lotief) was the first Louisiana wrestler to ever get in the finals of the NCAA Division I Nationals. **Daniel** lost to record setting Cade Sanderson of Iowa State. Daniel was a two-time Junior College National Champ while wrestling for Coby Junior College in Coby, Kansas.

Leonce Crump from Baton Rouge High School coached by Patrick Mahoney, placed fourth in the Division I NCAA National Tournament in 2001. **Crump** did not win a Lee title but was a state champ his junior year and a finalists his senior year.
